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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report provides an overview of the consultative workshop organized by the European Union Delegation to the Republic of Yemen, entitled "Agricultural Practices and Sustainable Livelihoods". Held on November 7th, 2024, the workshop aimed to address the challenges faced by the agricultural sector in Yemen and to promote innovative strategies for enhancing food security and community resilience.

The workshop brought together a diverse group of stakeholders, including agricultural experts, policymakers, and community leaders, who engaged in collaborative discussions and knowledge sharing. Key topics included sustainable farming techniques, effective water management practices, and the importance of crop diversification. Participants also had the opportunity to share their experiences and challenges, fostering a rich dialogue around local needs and solutions.

On November 7th, 2024, the Arab Youth Sustainable Development Network (AYSDN) had the privilege of participating in a consultative workshop organized by the European Union Delegation to the Republic of Yemen in coordination with NIRAS and DevPro. The workshop entitled "Agricultural Practices and Sustainable Livelihoods" focused on the critical themes of agriculture and its basic and developed practice and ways to sustainable livelihoods, recognizing their pivotal role in fostering resilience and economic growth within the region.

After the presentations, participants engaged in a group discussion focused on sustainable livelihoods through agriculture.

f. Group Discussion: Climate Change and Agriculture in Yemen

Participants convened for a second group discussion centered on the intersection of climate change and agriculture in Yemen.

7. Restitution of Group Discussions

To conclude the discussion segments, a restitution session was held where representatives from each group presented the key insights and recommendations generated during the discussions.

8. Closing Remarks

The workshop concluded with closing remarks from the organizers, summarizing the key themes and recommendations discussed throughout the day.

This structured agenda ensured a comprehensive exploration of critical issues related to agriculture and sustainability, fostering a collaborative atmosphere that encouraged participant engagement and knowledge sharing.

KEY DISCUSSIONS & INSIGHTS

The workshop generated a wealth of discussions and insights that highlighted the complexities and opportunities within the agricultural sector in Yemen. Participants engaged deeply with the themes presented, leading to valuable exchanges that informed actionable strategies for promoting sustainable livelihoods. Below are some of the key discussions and insights from the workshop:







Challenges in Agricultural Practices

Participants identified several key challenges affecting agricultural practices in Yemen, such as water scarcity, soil degradation, and market access. As most farmers voiced their concerns over the increasing input costs as well as a failure to provide supports, they encourage the adoption of more sustainable practices. All these challenges pointed out the continued need for focused interventions to improve resource management and access to tools and information necessary for farmers.

Role of Youth in Sustainable Agriculture

The presentation on youth-led initiatives held intriguing key elements for participants. It has been realized of the possibility contained in involving young people in agricultural innovation and decision-making. Thoughts from these conversations highlighted the need to train and empower young people to lead in sustainable practices as they bring much innovation and energy to the sector. Participants proposed that mentorship programs be established where seasoned farmers would guide youths interested in sustainable agriculture.

Adoption of Agroecological Practices

The discussion on agroecology highlighted its potential benefits for enhancing sustainability and resilience in agricultural systems. Participants shared success stories of farmers who have adopted agroecological methods, such as intercropping and organic farming, which have led to improved yields and reduced reliance on chemical inputs. Many expressed a desire for more training and resources to implement these practices effectively, emphasizing the need for ongoing education and support.

Climate Change Impacts

The group discussions on climate change revealed a consensus on the urgent need to address its impacts on agriculture in Yemen. Participants noted that changing weather patterns have resulted in unpredictable growing seasons and increased vulnerability to pests and diseases. The need for climate-resilient agricultural practices was a recurring theme, with participants brainstorming adaptive strategies such as drought-resistant crop varieties and improved irrigation techniques.

Community Engagement and Local Solutions

There was much emphasis in the discussions on community involvement in finding sustainable agriculture solutions. Participants expressed the importance of local knowledge and practices in support of a participatory approach that includes farmers in the decision-making process. It thus reaffirmed the fact that answers need to be context-specific and devised concerning the particular challenges that local communities are confronting.

Importance of Collaboration and Partnerships

The workshop underscored the significance of building partnerships among stakeholders, including government agencies, NGOs, and local communities. Participants recognized that collaborative efforts are essential for sharing resources and expertise to tackle the complex







challenges of sustainable agriculture. The discussions highlighted the need for platforms that facilitate ongoing dialogue and collaboration beyond the workshop.

Actionable Recommendations

The restitution session allowed participants to synthesize their discussions into actionable recommendations. Key suggestions included establishing training programs for sustainable practices, promoting youth engagement in agriculture, and developing policies that support local farmers. Participants also emphasized the importance of monitoring and evaluating initiatives to assess their effectiveness and adapt strategies as needed.

Overall, the key discussions and insights from the workshop reflected a deep commitment among participants to advancing sustainable agricultural practices in Yemen. The collaborative atmosphere fostered a sense of shared purpose, with many expressing enthusiasms for continuing the dialogue and implementing the ideas generated during the event.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE WORKSHOP

Based on the rich discussions and insights generated during the workshop, several actionable recommendations have emerged to promote sustainable agricultural practices and enhance livelihoods in Yemen. These recommendations aim to address the pressing challenges faced by the agricultural sector while leveraging the opportunities for innovation and collaboration.

First and foremost, it is essential to establish comprehensive training and capacity-building programs that focus on sustainable agricultural practices. These programs should cover a range of topics, including agroecology, organic farming, and effective water management techniques. Tailoring these initiatives to the specific needs of local farmers, especially women farmers, will ensure their relevance and effectiveness. Hands-on workshops, field demonstrations, and the creation of resource materials can significantly enhance the learning experience. Involving local experts and experienced farmers as trainers will not only add credibility but also foster a sense of community and shared knowledge.

Another vital aspect is the promotion of youth engagement in agriculture. By implementing initiatives that actively involve young people in sustainable practices and decision-making processes, we can inspire a new generation of farmers. Mentorship programs that connect youth with experienced farmers will provide invaluable guidance and support. Additionally, creating platforms for young people to share their innovative ideas can foster a culture of creativity and entrepreneurship within the agricultural sector.

Strengthening community engagement is also crucial. A participatory approach that involves local communities in the development and implementation of agricultural solutions will ensure that local perspectives are integrated into decision-making processes. Facilitating forums and workshops where community members can share their knowledge and







experiences will empower them and tailor solutions to the specific challenges faced by different regions.

Collaboration and partnerships among stakeholders need to be fostered to create a cohesive support network for sustainable agriculture. Building relationships among government agencies, non-governmental organizations, and the private sector will enhance the capacity to address complex challenges. Regular networking events and collaborative platforms can facilitate the exchange of resources, knowledge, and best practices, maximizing the impact of collective efforts.

Furthermore, it is imperative to focus on climate resilience. Developing and implementing strategies that enhance climate resilience in agricultural practices, such as promoting drought-resistant crop varieties and improving irrigation systems, is essential.
